WHY THIS EVENT?

Although there has been a significant evolution in our society on achieving gender equality among all aspects of life, there's still room for improvement. Women still represent less than a quarter of doctoral graduates in the ICT field (22%), while they represent 60% or more in the fields of health & welfare and education (60% and 67% respectively). Furthermore, in an entrepreneurial context, women-led businesses raise less venture capital than their male-only counterparts, including at the vital early-stage investments and the amounts that they raise tend to be lower.

Women bring diversity to teams, a wider perspective of society, innovation impact and unbiased view on startups from underrepresented communities. Since the beginning, EIT has been focused on supporting gender equality working along women on different projects and helping them shape the future of the agrifood sector. The INNOVEIT: Women Entrepreneurship & Leadership event is a testimony of the work EIT does towards achieving this goal, where key stakeholders of the industry will share their knowledge and discuss the role of women in the innovation and entrepreneurship fields.
