



Call for Test Farms Partner Organisation

EIT Food has designed a programme to link agricultural startups with farmers and testing-land, called Test Farms. Through enabling these links EIT Food wants to help innovative agritech startups to validate and test their products and services, showcase their business to customers and investors and finally support the technological transformation in European agriculture.

This programme has emerged following conversations and research with many agricultural startups. These startups cite the difficulties of finding the right farmers or land with which to validate their technologies or services. This programme also arose to help bring about the much-needed smart revolution we need in agriculture. The integration of technology and new methods of farming bring with them the opportunity to increase yields, nutrition and steward precious agricultural resources.

EIT Food is going to scale the Test Farms programme that has run in 2019 in Poland and Spain on a small scale. To do so we are looking for a new partner to support us with this programme in the North-Eastern and Southern part of Europe. The possible countries for expanding the test farms programme are Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Portugal, Serbia, Spain, Turkey, Italy and Greece.

The role of the partner organisation in this project will be to facilitate the network of farmers in Europe. EIT Food will provide the network of startups and together the matchmaking between farmers and 20-25 startups will be done during multiple events with about 5-7 startups participating per event.

The programme will run from February till December 2020 and will entail the following steps:

- Scouting for agricultural startups and approaching them to participate in the programme.
- Identifying farmers and approaching them to participate in the programme.
- Pre-matching startups and farmers.
- 3-4 matchmaking events with farm visits on the next day.
- Piloting phase up to 1 year.
- Demo Day at the farm to showcase the results to other local farmers, if tests have been successful.
- Reporting on the results and impact of the programme.

1. Profile EIT Food partner organisation

1.1 Requirements:

- Legal entity
- Directly working with farmers (e.g. consulting, farm management, etc.) and a good understanding of their farm characteristics and challenges.



- Large, quantifiable network of farmers open to participate in the testing of new innovative solutions in least 1 of the following countries: (Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Portugal, Serbia, Spain, Turkey, Italy, Greece)
- Previous proven experience in introducing innovations to farmers and/or matchmaking startups with farmers
- Agricultural experts to oversee and assist entrepreneurs during the pilot phase with expertise and knowledge.
- Ability to speak local language (of the farmers) and English.

1.2 Additional assets (not required but it's a plus to have them):

- Own agricultural land for startups who don't want a partnership with a farmer, but just a simple field to test their products.
- Providing access to testing facilities for startups to check their readings on measurements such as soil moisture, soil composition, product nutrition profile, air moisture, temperature etc.

2. Partner's involvement:

- Co-creating the application form to ensure the right information to match the startups with farmers is gathered.
- Pre-matching based on startups profiles, requirements and preferences for different types of farms.
- Organisation of the matchmaking event, meant for matching startups with pre-matched farmers and designing the plan of their test project
 - Venue etc.
 - Reimbursing the travel costs of the farmers.
 - Agricultural experts to assist designing the pilot project plan.
- Overseeing the testing phase by the agricultural experts.
- Providing translation support if needed for the startup/farmer.
- Support in organizing the demo days at the farms – recruitment of the participants (potential clients), advise on the programme.
- Test Farms programme communication and reach-out (publishing the call for startups/farmers, progress of the pilot tests, promoting the demo days, results - spreading the word about the potential of the solutions).
- The contract will from March till December 2020.

4. Selection process

Interested and eligible organisations are invited to submit their applications by 16 February 2020, using the “EIT Food Test Farms partner organisation – Application Form”. Please send the electronic version of the application, based on the form provided below, to: adriana.balazy@eitfood.eu. Please write in the subject line of your e-mail: “Application partner organisation Test Farms”. Incomplete applications or applications submitted by ineligible organisations will be automatically rejected. Complete applications received by EIT Food will be evaluated by a committee including representatives of EIT Food using selection criteria presented in point 5. EIT Food reserves the right to designate the subcontractors only if the submitted applications ensure the excellence and value for money, and to relaunch the call if the present selection process would not yield satisfactory results. EIT Food reserves the right to contact the applicant organisations by e-mail or phone asking for additional explanations or supporting documents, and to schedule selection interviews with short-listed organisations. All applications will be evaluated using transparent selection criteria and the results of the call will be directly communicated to all organisations participating in the call; the chosen provider will be required to sign subcontracting agreements with one/several local offices of EIT Food.

5. Selection criteria

All proposals will be evaluated considering the following criteria, related to the applicant organisation and EIT Food Startup Test Farms programme:

1. Size and quality of the network of farmers in the target countries (number of farmers; diversity of the type of farmers (various crops, livestock, sizes of the farms etc.) number of countries, type of collaboration between applying entity and farmers).
2. Role in the ecosystem (familiarity with the agri-food industry in the target countries; existing contacts and projects with relevant local stakeholders).
3. Experience in training and supporting farmers, especially regarding introducing new technologies (examples of the most relevant workshops/trainings/programs of your organisation from 2016-2020 that were provided to farmers from your target regions including a short description of these activities, key outcomes and impact);



4. Agricultural knowledge and expertise - type of experts, field of their expertise and experience which can be used during the Test Farms programme
5. Available agricultural research and/or testing resources: describe the type, size and availability of available infrastructure (can be own or of a third party).
6. Approach to the matchmaking process between farmers and startups, including the matchmaking events.
7. Approach to the demo days at the farms.
8. Cost of service planned by applicant.

The maximum budget for the partner organisation (or consortium of organisations) to execute all described activities cannot exceed the amount of €60.000 in total. In case you are applying for multiple of the target countries, please make a breakdown per country in the budget. The applicant with the lowest price will receive the maximum score in the evaluation, the other applicants will receive proportionally lower scores.

Criteria 1-7 will be evaluated on a 0-15 scale: 0 – not satisfactory; 5 – satisfactory; 10 – good and 15 Criteria 1-7 will be evaluated on a 0-15 scale: 0 – not satisfactory; 5 – satisfactory; 10 – good and 15 – very good. The application can receive max. 60% of total score for criteria 1-7. In criteria 8 the application with the lowest price will receive 40% of total score while other applications will receive proportionally lower numbers.
